President's Message

First, the bad news: most of the bills for the Book Sale are in and it's not looking so hot in the profit department this year. Now the good news: the balance in our bank account is still quite healthy. We can still go forward with scholarships and other budgeted items for the year.

There were a lot of factors in play this year that may have had a significant effect on our Book Sale downturn. Last year, the public library book sales were on temporary hiatus due to building construction. This year, we had unseasonably warm and beautiful weather. Some of us knew that if we weren't volunteering, we surely wouldn't be there!

I also think that the bad economy is a double-edged sword. While many people are looking for bargains – ways to keep themselves educated or entertained, people are also cutting down on discretionary personal spending. One of the used booksellers who attended the first day of the book sale reported to one of our members that *his* sales had dropped 40% in the last year.

It was also a tough year because our Book Sale had no leaders. Last year, we were unable to find anyone willing to co-chair the sale. Because we depend on this sale to allow us to support our local scholarships, contribute to national funds, and do many other things that help us fulfill our mission, we didn't feel we could just not do it.

We planned and prepared the book sale "by committee" and while it wasn't a disaster, I don't think we should do it that way again. It was harder. There were mistakes, duplications, and uncertainties that probably would have been averted if we on the committee weren't trying to be both coordinators and do-ers. I would have to use another page for this column if I were only to list only my own "d'oh!" moments.





Congress resumes work in mid-November, and the Paycheck Fairness Act, S. 3772, needs our support to help it pass. Even if you contacted him earlier, encourage Senator Kohl to

lend his support to this bill when the Senate votes on it on November 17. Senator Feingold has long been on the AAUW side of the issue, and this may be our best chance, before Congress adjourns, to get it passed. 2011 will bring many new faces to federal and state government positions, faces that will represent you. Think about how inexperienced many of these people are. Remember, they will represent you, whether you voted for them or not. **How will they know what you want them to support?** Now is not the time to allow laws to be passed and policies enacted that do not support AAUW issues. We must contact those in office—we know that those opposed to our issues will!

Under Stay Informed, find the link to the registration form for alerts about current Wisconsin legislation, and requests to contact legislators. Now it will be easier than ever to know what is happening, and to influence what is done.



To replace your pre-election reading, try the AAUW blog. There was an interesting <u>post</u> on November 5, "Midterm Elections: Good and Bad News for Women," by Rachel Wallace. It's a good summary of the numbers of women elected, the influence of women like Nancy Pelosi and Sarah Palin, and the record-breaking statistics about women in government. Here's an example of her writing, "As the Republican leadership moves into the House, it's important that the boys' club has a few women around, and I trust Palin and some of her friends will make sure that happens."
