On the national level, the Obama administration cleared the way for a \$50 million contribution to the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), the first U.S. donation since 2002. The UNFPA, which is supported by 180 member nations of the United Nations, works to reduce poverty, improve the health of women and children, prevent HIV/AIDS, and provide family planning assistance to women in 154 countries. AAUW celebrates the reinstated U.S. contribution to UNFPA as a vital effort to advance women and girls' equity on a global level. Our State Convention in Wisconsin Rapids is scheduled for May 1-3. This year the Branch delegation includes Margot Bouchard, Lois Helland, and Kim Wellnitz who all hold state level Board offices as well as Cleo Powers, Kate Hinnant, Mary Hayden and Linda Spaeth.

AAUW members know how important it is to be a part of the informed electorate and to cast our vote. Now a new U.S. government report has been released which should make us proud to belong to AAUW, a non-profit organization that helps preserve our democracy.

How Nonprofits Helped America Vote

Last week, <u>OMB Watch</u> released a new report, <u>How Nonprofits Helped America Vote: 2008</u>, which clarifies the important role that nonprofits have in encouraging voter engagement in the United States. The report demonstrates how nonprofits protect election integrity and use various ways to get out the vote. Lee Mason, OMB Watch director of nonprofit speech rights, said, "This report showcases just how important it is for nonprofit organizations of all stripes to continue and increase their nonpartisan voter engagement activities."

AAUW members across the country enthusiastically participated in AAUW's The Power of One Vote campaign that successfully helped turn out women voters across the country for the 2008 elections. <u>AAUW's Voter</u> <u>Education Campaign</u> encourages women voters to get involved in the political process and shows the impact congressional action has on their lives.
