



Equal Pay Day

Mark your calendar in red. Tuesday, April 9 has been designated as Equal Pay Day 2013 —the day that symbolizes the non-equal pay that women receive. The date represents the 16 months that women have to work to earn the amount that men earn in 12 months. Although the pay gap between men and women seemed to be narrowing, it has remained the same for the last several years. Women still earn between 75% and 80% of men's wages.

AAUW and other organizations have compiled many wonderful resources on this topic. Recently our national AAUW team made extensive changes to the site www.aauw.org, and at the moment it is difficult to navigate the site from links. I suggest using the SEARCH box on the website and type in terms like "pay equity resource kit," "equal pay day," "behind the pay gap," or "simple truth about the gender pay gap."

How can you call attention to the pay gap and work for progress in pay equity?

- Contact your Congressional members. Encourage them to cosponsor the Paycheck Fairness Act. The easiest way to do this is by using the <u>Two Minute Activist</u> on the AAUW website.
- Join us on Tuesday, April 9, for our UW-Eau Claire Equal Pay Day
 activities. We will again work with 9to5 to raise awareness of the pay
 gap and what it means to women and men of all ages. I have
 reserved a table in Hibbard Hall and, in a moment of optimism that
 spring will be here by then, also a table on the Campus Mall. We will


