

# Public Policy

The significance of our public policy activism was underscored in the film **Patsy Mink: Ahead of the Majority**, whose story inspired lively discussion among branch members on a gray January Saturday. The name of this crusading Hawaii Congresswoman has been affixed to groundbreaking Title IX legislation that passed in the '70's with strong AAUW support. As a result the numbers of

American women in graduate schools increased from 10% to 50% while girls earned a permanent place in public school sports.

Our next February 23 branch meeting features an award winning North High School health educator addressing a top priority state AAUW education issue -- accurate, appropriate and comprehensive sex education. After a decade of decline, teen birth rates and sexually transmitted diseases are rising among Wisconsin youth. Wisconsin AAUW supports the Healthy Youth Act (AB 458), requiring that teens receive complete and accurate information in our public schools to protect and save lives.

Our local State Senators and YOU need to hear why a health curriculum like Deb Tackman's, tackling tough issues such as drinking and sexually explicit behavior, is critical for today's teens. (The Wisconsin State Assembly has already passed AB 458 with support of our local Representatives Jeff Smith and Kristin Dexter.)

Late-breaking news: AB 458 has passed the state Senate and is headed to the Governor's desk.

At www.aauwaction.org your will find AAUW's Congressional Voting Record that provides both members and the public with critical information on how their representatives voted in 2009 on issues affecting women and girls. 2009 successes for AAUW include House passage of Federal Employees Paid Parental Leave Act, Student Aid and Fiscal Responsibility Act. Disappointments include the House Stupak Vote to eliminate the options on insurance coverage for abortion in pending Health Care legislation, and Senate failure to pass the Paycheck Fairness Act, while also advancing proposals for school vouchers.

Share this electronic Voting Record with friends (local and national) to inform them of both AAUW priorities and the performance of their own representatives. Senators Feingold and Kohl have 100% voting records on AAUW issues in 2009. January's U.S. Supreme Court decision allowing unlimited monetary support by corporations and unions for or against candidates (national, state or local) will have unprecedented impact on elections. This makes accurate information like AAUW's **Congressional Voting Record** even more significant to help counter misrepresentations of those now serving in Congress.
