With that being said, let me introduce our slate of nominees for office:



#### **Butternut Squash and Apple Soup** Kim Wellnitz

Use 1 ½ large or 3-4 small butternut squash
Cut in half, put flesh side down in microwaveable dish
Add 1 cup water
Microwave about 9-12 minutes or until tender
Remove and let cool
Scoop out flesh and set aside (discard seeds and skin)

Chop one round onion Chop 3-4 stalks of celery \*Fresh ground pepper \*\*Cook in 1 -2 tablespoons of olive oil until tender

Add two diced apples (I leave skin on)
Heat for a few minutes,
Then add some vegetable stock
Heat until soft
I use a hand immersion blender and
blend until smooth

Add butternut squash Add vegetable stock Blend until smooth and add more stock until desired consistency

Serve topped with bacon bits.
\*I don't add extra salt because the bacon


is salty and I don't use low sodium vegetable stock.

\*\*You can fry the bacon first, then use some of the bacon fat to cook the onion and celery for a non-vegetarian option.

# Public Policy

Every year that day rolls around, the day when women's wages catch up to men's wages from the previous year. We DO

have to work a lot longer to earn the same salary! We know that the situation has improved since 1963, when the Equal Pay Act was passed, but women still make only \$.78 for every dollar that men earn. It's interesting to see that the gap is still real, in spite of the increased numbers of women earning degrees, and the entry of women into STEM and other non-traditional fields. You may hear the claim that it is the life decisions that women make that result in their lower salaries. The issue is more complicated than this, and that statement does not explain the differences in starting salary between men and women who leave collage after earning identical degrees.
